CLARKSTON TOWN COUNCIL NOTICE OF COUNCILMEMBER VACANCY

CLARKSTON TOWN COUNCIL HEREBY GIVES NOTICE THAT THERE IS A COUNCILMEMBER SEAT VACANT.

4 YEAR TERM (JANUARY 1, 2022 - DECEMBER 31, 2025)

Persons interested in being appointed to fill the vacancy may make application to the Clarkston Town Clerk until end of business (1:00 pm.) on Tuesday **January 4, 2022.**

Application forms are available at the
Town Clerk's office.

The Clarkston Town Council will hold a Special Town Council Meeting on Thursday, January 6, 2022 at 7:00 p.m., at the Clarkston Town Hall, 50 South Main, Clarkston, at which time an appointment will be made to fill the vacancy.

Qualifications for office are:

- Have been a resident of Clarkston Town for at least 12 consecutive months immediately prior to application
- Be a registered voter

BUILDING PERMITS OR ZONING CLEARANCE PERMITS ARE REQUIRED



The LUDMA Commission would like to remind everyone that if you plan to build any kind of building, structure, or addition, big or small, a Zoning Clearance Permit is required **before** you build.

If the building, structure, or addition is bigger than 200 sq. ft. a Building Permit is required.

CLARKSTON'S CANINE RESIDENTS

Clarkston Town requires all dogs, indoor or outdoor, to be registered and have proof of rabies vaccination.



Our Annual Dog License Registration and Rabies Vaccination Clinic will be held on **February 26, 2022 from 10:00 A.M. to Noon** at the Roads Building (east of the Town Hall).

Registration Costs:

\$3 for an animal that has been spayed or neutered
\$10 for an intact animal
\$75 for a kennel license for 4 to 6 dogs
-Clarkston does not allow more than 6 dogs

Shots/Vaccinations:

Rabies - \$15
Distemper/Parvo/Lepto (Da2PPV) Combo - \$16
Bordetella Vaccine - \$15
All Three - \$40

There is no need to wait until the clinic to license your dogs. Dog Licenses may be obtained, during business hours, at the Town Hall by bringing in proof of the dog's current rabies shot, if needed, and the appropriate fee. You can also mail it or put it in the drop box at the Town Hall.

Unfortunately, we cannot accept dog licensing fees through Xpress (our online bill pay website). Anything you pay through this medium will go toward your utility bill.

Dog licenses are considered delinquent as of March 1st. At that time, fees double and a delinquent list is sent to Animal Control.

BUSINESS LICENSES

BUSINESS

If you have a business or plan to have a business in 2022, a business license is required (Code 3-1-4). **In April of this year, the Town Council passed Resolution 21-08 instating a \$15/yearly administrative fee for business licenses.**

If you were issued a business license in 2021 a Business License Renewal Form will be sent out with the January 2022 utility statements. Please make any changes on the form, if applicable, sign it, and return it along with the \$15 administrative fee to the Town Hall as soon as possible.

If you have not renewed your business license by March 31st a delinquent fee of \$50.00 will be applied.

WINTER PARKING REMINDER

Clarkston's winter parking regulations went into effect November 15 (Code 6-1-4E). Please be sure to keep vehicles off the streets between the hours of 10 pm and 6 am until March 15.

It is also very helpful to pull your garbage and recycling containers in from the roadway as soon as possible after pickup. Thank you for your help in keeping Clarkston's roads drivable and safe.

HEAT PROGRAM

The Home Energy Assistance Target (HEAT) program provides winter utility assistance to low-income households targeting those who are truly vulnerable – the lowest-income households with the highest heating costs, the disabled, the elderly, and families with preschool-age children. This assistance is available between November 1 and April 30.
